The Henry Fork Service Center

Centenary's Dana Tyson Circle has spent many hours clipping and organizing the labels donated by members – and they are sent to the Henry Fork Service Center in Rocky Mount, VA. But what happens there?



The Henry Fork Service Center is a multi-purpose mission outreach of the Danville District of the United Methodist Church. Its mission is "making God's love visible" in the Henry Fork Community: by acting as a positive Christian presence; by being a place where children, youth and adults can come to spend creative time; by offering a helping hand and listening ear to those with problems; by exemplifying Christ as Lord and Savior to all persons in its caring ministry

Their programs include Preschool, After School and Summer programs for children. It all began with one woman – Charlotte Seegars – and a vacant service station. She saw great need in the economically depressed region and in 1967 decided to do something about it. Fighting, neglect, unemployment, broken homes, abuse, truancy, low incomes, illegitimacy and running moonshine (now drug trafficking) were a few of the problems. Now there is hope.

Ora Hodges is a success story. She came at age 2, the oldest of 4 children. Her mother dropped out of school. But Ora was ready for school because the preschool program prepared her. Later, Ora got the homework help she needed after school. She grew in her faith in God at the center and started taking a church bus to worship. Ora was a Franklin County High School honor graduate. She married and worked at the Pluma textile factory. Her sons benefited from the love at the Henry Fork Service Center program.

Ora came back to the center for encouragement after the factory layoff. Grants and scholarships enabled her to afford college. She graduated from Ferrum College with a 3.92 GPA in accounting in 2003. She works at the Franklin County Commissioner of Revenue office. She is now giving back as the Henry Fork Treasurer and Board Member. Her new dream is to become a Certified Public Accountant.

Church Plans \$10.4 Million Project for Haiti

As America's first lady Michelle Obama appealed to the world not to forget Haiti, the United Methodist Committee on Relief backed a three-year, \$10.4 million earthquake relief and recovery program for the ravaged nation. The relief agency's directors approved funding for the "Helping Haiti Rebuild" Project on April 13, the same day as Michelle Obama's surprise visit there. The board's mission volunteers' office announced that more than 3,000 individuals volunteered for future work team assignments to Haiti.

Kaya Bawili and Mugaluru Murumbi worry about each of their 19 children. After April 15, they will be able to rest easier



knowing all their loved ones will be sleeping under insecticide-treated mosquito nets donated by religious organizations including The United Methodist Church. The Murumbi household is one of 12 that will be visited by VIPs from government and faith groups at the Katanga World Malaria Day celebration organized by an alliance of eight Christian and Muslim congregations.

About the Old City Cemetery

Lynchburg's Old City Cemetery, located on Taylor Street, is a beautiful garden and monument to those who passed on before. Also known as the Old Methodist Cemetery, this registered historic landmark opened in 1806 as a public burying ground. The 26-acre site features more than 2000 historic gravestones, monuments, and ironwork enclosures as well as a Butterfly Garden & Lotus Pond, a garden of 19th-century shrubs and local architectural relics; the Pest House Medical Museum; the Cemetery Center; the Hearse House & Caretakers' Museum; the Station House Museum; and the Confederate Section containing 2200 graves of Civil War soldiers from 14 states.

The Cemetery also holds significant African-American history, from slavery to integration. A garden of old roses also adorns the graveyard. Bring a camera along, and be sure to pet the cats! (*from VisitLynchburg.org*)

UM Map to Change in June

United Methodists will draw a new map of U.S. structures following May and June sessions of annual (regional) conferences. United Methodist clergy and lay members in New York, New England and Pennsylvania annual conferences will say goodbyes to friends and conference structures when they meet this May and June. Members will say goodbye to Troy, North Central New York, Western New York, Wyoming, and Central Pennsylvania conferences and hello to the Upper New York and the Susquehanna conferences.

Applying Bible Principles

If you read annual reports from publicly held companies or banks, you will frequently see the word "fiduciary." Fiduciary is used as an adjective to describe something which is held in trust. It is also used as a noun to describe the one who is a trustee who must account for that which is held in trust.

For example, a bank president has a fiduciary responsibility to stockholders in the bank and to depositors who place their money in the bank. A company treasurer has a fiduciary responsibility to the owners of the company. A payroll clerk has a fiduciary responsibility to pay people what they have earned.

You may never have considered yourself a fiduciary, and you may never have acted officially in a fiduciary capacity, but in reality, you are a fiduciary. All of us are. That applies both to Christians and to those who are not part of God's family through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. We who are Christians will stand before the Judgment Seat of Christ. There, we will not be judged for salvation, since the penalty and judgment for sin was settled once and for all on the cross of Calvary when the Lord Jesus paid the price for our sin. Instead, when we stand before Christ, we will give an account of how we have used what God has entrusted to us.

Just as a bank president must account to stockholders and depositors on how their funds are used, we must account to Christ for how we have used what God has entrusted to us. Since everything we have rightfully belongs to Him, we will need to report on how we have managed His assets!

As you consider how you have used what God has entrusted to your care and keeping during the past few months, what kind of job have you done? And more importantly, as a "fiduciary" of what God has placed in your hands, will you stand before Him with joy, eager to report on your giving and management of His assets?

These gifts are fine

Toys: Bear, soft toy, tennis ball, finger puppet, jigsaw, yo-yo, building blocks, small musical instrument. For boys trucks and cars, for girls dolls, clip on earrings etc. Educational supplies: Felt pens, pens, pencils, pencil sharpener, eraser, coloring book, notepad, picture or puzzle book, chalk, pencil case, stickers etc.

Hygiene items: Toothbrush, toothpaste, hairbrush, comb, hair clips, bar of soap, flannel etc.

Other items: Sweets (sell by date to be at least March of the following year), gloves, scarf, sunglasses, cap, hat, bangles, necklaces etc

No thanks, these items should not be included

No food especially chocolate. Only exception, non chocolate sweets are allowed.

No medicine or vitamins of any kind.

No war related items: Toy guns, soldiers or knives

No fragile items: Glass containers, mirrors.

No liquids: including blow bubbles, shampoo, bubble bath, toiletry sets or aerosols

No dangerous items: Any sharp objects/scissors/razors

Nothing of a political nature.

Facebook at Centenary? Yes! Here's A closer Look! Facebook, the largest social networking website according to 2010 Compete.com by worldwide monthly active users, followed by [MySpace](http://MySpace.com), and third by Twitter.

Facebook is operated and privately owned by Facebook, Inc, and since September 2006, anyone over the age of 13 with a valid e-mail address can become a Facebook user. Facebook's target audience is more for an adult demographic than today's youth. Users can add friends and send them messages; update their personal profiles to notify friends about themselves; and users can join networks organized by workplace, school, or college.

The website's name stems from the colloquial name of books given to students at the start of the academic year by university administrations in the US with the intention of helping students to get to know each other better.

Facebook was founded by Mark Zuckerberg with his college roommates and fellow computer science students Eduardo Saverin, Dustin Moskovitz and Chris Hughes. The website's membership was initially limited by the founders to Harvard students, but was expanded to other colleges in the Boston area, the Ivy League, and Stanford University. It then expanded further to include (potentially) any university student, then high school students, and, finally, to anyone aged 13 and over. The website currently has more than 400 million active users worldwide, as of 2009.

We are not abandoning the church website, but simply expanding with today's technology and tomorrow's future.
